Team Member Spotlight: Dustin Molloy, Operations Manager

As part of our continuing series of team member spotlights, we'd like to introduce you to Dustin Molloy, our Operations Manager. Dustin is charged with ensuring the District's water plant is run and maintained properly so it continues to produce safe drinking water in accordance with all state and federal regulations.



Dustin joined the Todd Creek Village Metropolitan District in February of 2017 bringing more than five years of municipal water system maintenance and management experience. Prior to joining Todd Creek Village, he worked for the Town of Orchard City as the Superintendent, the Cherokee Metropolitan District where he was responsible for monitoring and maintaining booster pump stations, chlorine systems, a fire hydrant system with 700 hydrants, as well as general operations and customer service related aspects of the water utility. He also worked with the Eagle River Water and Sanitation District where he handled the maintenance of the water treatment facilities, including repair and service of plants, wells, pump stations, storage tanks, and related equipment.

Dustin attended Pikes Peak Community College studying water and waste water sciences. He holds Class A Water Plant Operator, Class 2 Distribution System Operator, and Class 1 Collections System Operator certifications from the State of Colorado.

Dustin is the proud single father of two sons, aged 13 and 18. When not working, he enjoys fishing, computer gaming, and electronics design, especially when he can do it with his sons. He is currently working on a project to design artificial muscles and incorporate them into an artificial intelligence pet.
