Grant Secured for First Phase of PFAS Mitigation

ast December we let you know that the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) changed the minimum standards for Per-and Polyfluoroalkyl Substances (PFAS) creating a significant negative impact on many public (municipal) water suppliers, including Todd Creek Village. PFAS are commonly referred to as 'forever chemicals' because they require significant energy to breakdown. At the time, we assured you that we were working closely with the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment (CDPHE) to address and resolve the issue as quickly as possible.

Currently, a reliable, safe, and cost-effective means for destruction of these per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances has not been identified. Since destruction options are not available to the district, we need to instead focus on identifying and selecting a removal technology that meets our needs. To facilitate this and ensure the district selects the most cost-effective technology, we will be performing sampling and pilot testing in the coming months. This sampling and testing process carries a significant cost.

Fortunately, we were able to partner with CDPHE to apply for a grant that will cover the cost of the sampling and pilot testing so there is no impact to the budget for Todd Creek Village. We are pleased to announce that we have received confirmation that the grant has been approved. We are now awaiting additional instructions on how to move forward with the sampling and pilot testing process.

We will provide updated information as we progress through this sampling and testing phase and have news to report. As always, our number one priority is providing the best quality water and customer service possible to our customers in the most cost-effective and efficient manner.
